The Florida Center for Early Childhood, a nonprofit serving children and their families in Sarasota, Charlotte, Manatee and DeSoto/Hardee counties, received a \$5,000 grant from the Harold C. and Jacqueline F. Bladel Foundation to help provide developmental therapies to children from birth to 8 years of age.

The grant will be used to provide therapy sessions, as well as purchase equipment and materials that will help children with sensory integration challenges.

The multidisciplinary team of licensed speech-language pathologists and occupational therapists, and certified infant-toddler developmental specialists, work together and alongside mental health and educational colleagues to provide services to children with developmental delays, as well as established diagnoses that include Autism Spectrum Disorder, Fetal Alcohol Syndrome, Down syndrome, cerebral palsy and Attention Deficit Disorder with Hyperactivity.

The Florida Center for Early Childhood has been awarded an Imagination Playground in a Cart, an innovative playground equipment system, thanks to a grant provided by Target and national nonprofit KaBOOM!

KaBOOM!, which is dedicated to giving all kids the childhood they deserve through great, safe places to play, is working with Target to increase access to play across the country. Grants for Imagination Playgrounds are helping to achieve that goal by bringing active play to more than 430,000 kids across the country.

Imagination Playground in a Cart is an innovative design in play equipment that encourages creativity, communication and collaboration in play. With a collection of custom-designed, oversized blue foam parts, Imagination Playground provides a changing array of elements that allow children to turn their playground into a space constantly built and rebuilt by their imagination.

Meals on Wheels PLUS of Manatee, operating as the Food Bank of Manatee, recently received a donation of \$35,000 from the **Publix** "Food for All" campaign. The money was raised during the holidays, when Publix gives customers and associates the opportunity to contribute \$1, \$3 or \$5.
